1. Introduction

- At the last JPB/NCDP held in Uyo, NISER made a presentation on:
 - "The Role of Research in Policy Formulation & Implementation"
- The presentation highlighted the need for:
 - More analytic work on social and economic issues at the State level.
 - The presentation then recommended the need for:
 - State Governments to establish State Research Institute (SRI) under the guidance of the NPC;
 - State Planning Commission (SPC) and SRI to encourage DPRS to conduct research;
 - Research staff of DPRS to undertake Internship at relevant Think Tanks, including NISER; and
 - Strong political support and resource allocation for research at all levels off Government, most especially at the State level.





2. State-NISER Collaborative Research

- We are developing specific areas of interest
- In the process of bringing up an MoU

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3. Update on Establishment of State Research Institute (SRI)

- No State has reported it has established SRI
- SRI is important to complement State Statistical Bureau
- It is also important to provide guidance to DPRS on research matters

1. Agricultural Resources for Economic Development at the State Level



- the need to understand the nexus between agricultural resource endowment and the development paradigms at the State level.
- Objectives
 - i. Identify the agricultural resources (water, crops, livestock, fisheries and forestry) available in each State;
 - ii. Examine the actual and potential contributions of these resources to the economic development of the State;
 - iii. Examine the constraints engendering actual as well as the potential contributions; and
 - iv. Propose policy recommendations for scaling-up and scaling-out agricultural resources for economic development at the State level.





- 2. Challenges and Strategies of Community Policing in Enhancing Security in Nigeria
 - Motivation:
 - the increasing security challenges facing the country and its attendant's socio-economic consequences
 - Objectives
 - i. Identify the gaps in the existing security apparatus in coping with the insecurity situation in the country;
 - ii. Examine the possibility of adopting community policing and integrating it into the national security framework;
 - iii. Assess stakeholder's perception with respect to community policing; and
 - iv. Assess the legal, institutional and logistic, framework for community policing.





- 3. Socio-Economic Impact of Municipal Governance and Urban Renewal Programmes in South-West Nigeria
 - Motivation:
 - Many States are known to have commenced various forms of urban renewal programmes in order to address infrastructural deficits in their respective states
 - Objectives
 - i. To identify what factors necessitate urban renewal programmes in the State;
 - ii. To explicate and describe the form and character of urban renewal programmes being implemented in the State;
 - iii. To assess the impact of urban renewal programmes on citizens of the State; and
 - To identify steps put in place to ensure the continuity and sustainability of urban renewal programmes beyond the lifespan of a current regime.





4. Conflicts between Farmers and Pastoralists: Resolving the Economic, Social and Political Challenges

Motivation:

In Nigeria, citizens' claims over access to certain resources such as land, minerals and water have become very volatile and explosive in several states of the Federation

Objectives

- To identify the underlying drivers of conflicts between i. pastoralists and farmers in the affected states in Nigeria;
- ii. To examine the political economy issues involved in the conflicts;
- iii. To identify and assess the efforts so far put in place to resolve the conflicts between pastoralists and farmers in Nigeria;
- To determine how successful the efforts to resolve the conflicts iv. between pastoralists and farmers in Nigeria have been; and
- To identify measures to be taken to ensure sustainable peace in **V**. conflict-prone states.





5. Conflict Resolution in the NDDC-Mandate States: Towards Effective Management of the Petroleum Host Communities Fund (PHCF)



Motivation:

The need for a region that is economically prosperous, socially stable, ecologically regenerative and politically peaceful



- i. To assess host communities' perception of the benefits of PHCF in their areas;
- ii. To examine the extent to which the PHCF can resolve the lingering conflict in host communities;
- To examine the synergy between the PHCF and other strategies for resolving the conflicts in NDDC- Mandate States; and
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6. Framework for Public Investment Efficiency at the State Level in Nigeria



- Motivation:
 - In the face of dwindling resources and huge public investment demands, it is vital for State Governments to develop robust strategies and criteria for allocating resources



- i. Determine the underlying criteria, mechanisms and patterns of allocation of public investments by State Governments;
- ii. Randomly select successful and not so successful investment projects by State Governments and subject them to the efficiency framework;



iv. Assess the levels and types of capacity (skills/resources) available in states for public investment analysis.





7. Innovative Approaches to Revenue Mobilisation at the State Level in Nigeria



- The need to enhance the viability of State Governments and deemphasise high level of dependence on statutory allocations
- Objectives
 - To examine the legal, institutional and administrative arrangements for revenue mobilization evenue mobilisation fund;
 - ii. To determine the degree of adoption of innovative approaches to revenue mobilisation;
 - iii. To identify bottlenecks to the adoption of these approaches; and
 - iv. To proffer strategies for shoring up revenue at the State level.





5. Conclusion and Recommendations

- State Governments should establish State Research Institute (SRI) to complement their Statistical Agency
- State Planning Commission (SPC) and SRI to encourage DPRS to conduct research
- Research staff of DPRS to undertake Internship at relevant Think Tanks, including NISER
- Strong political support and resource allocation for research at all levels off Government, most especially at the State level
- State Governments to consider the Concept Notes that NISER has developed
- NPC and NISER to provide support to State Governments on research-related matters.
