Budget hearings, citizen's budget, citizen monitors

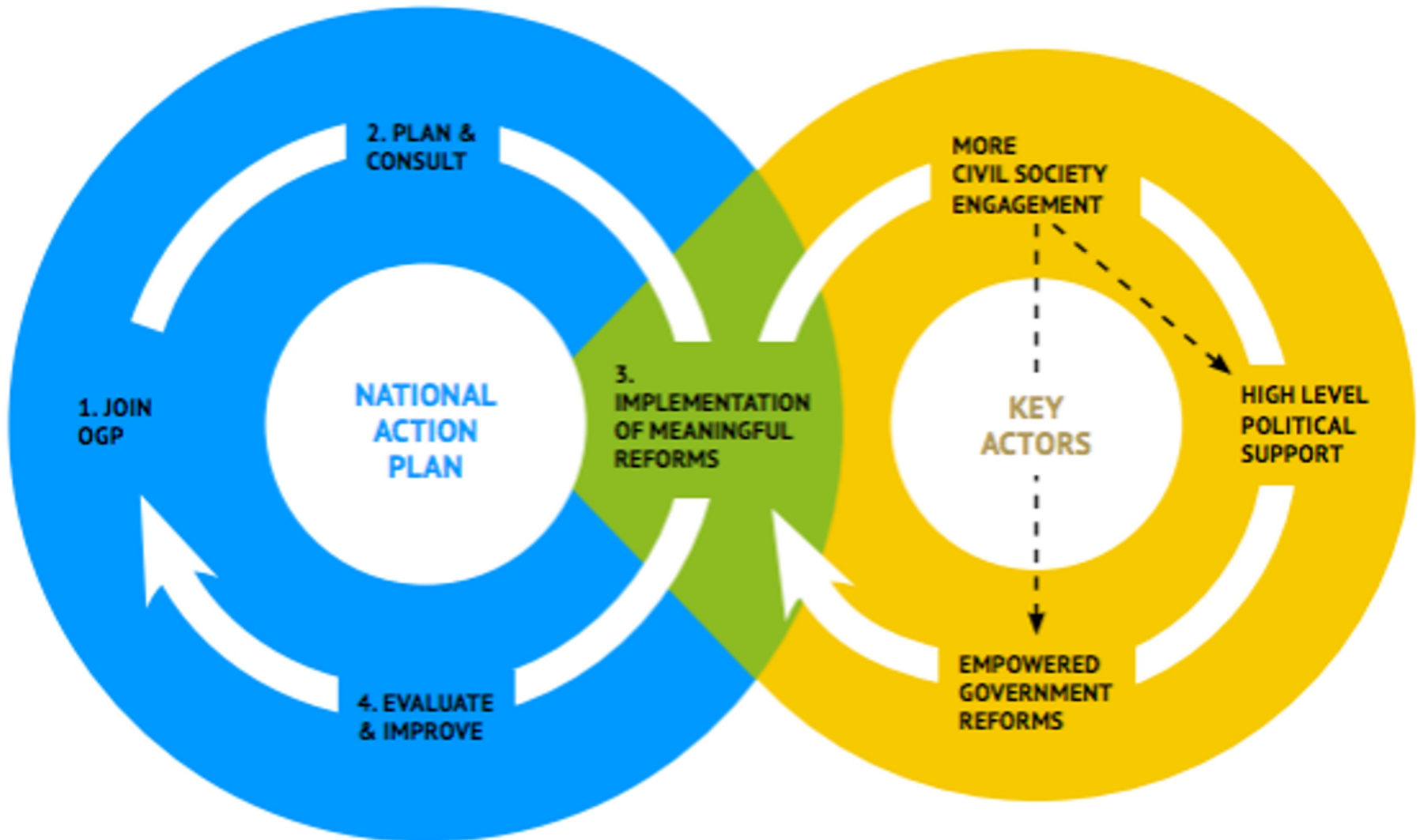

Government and Civil Society co-create the action plan

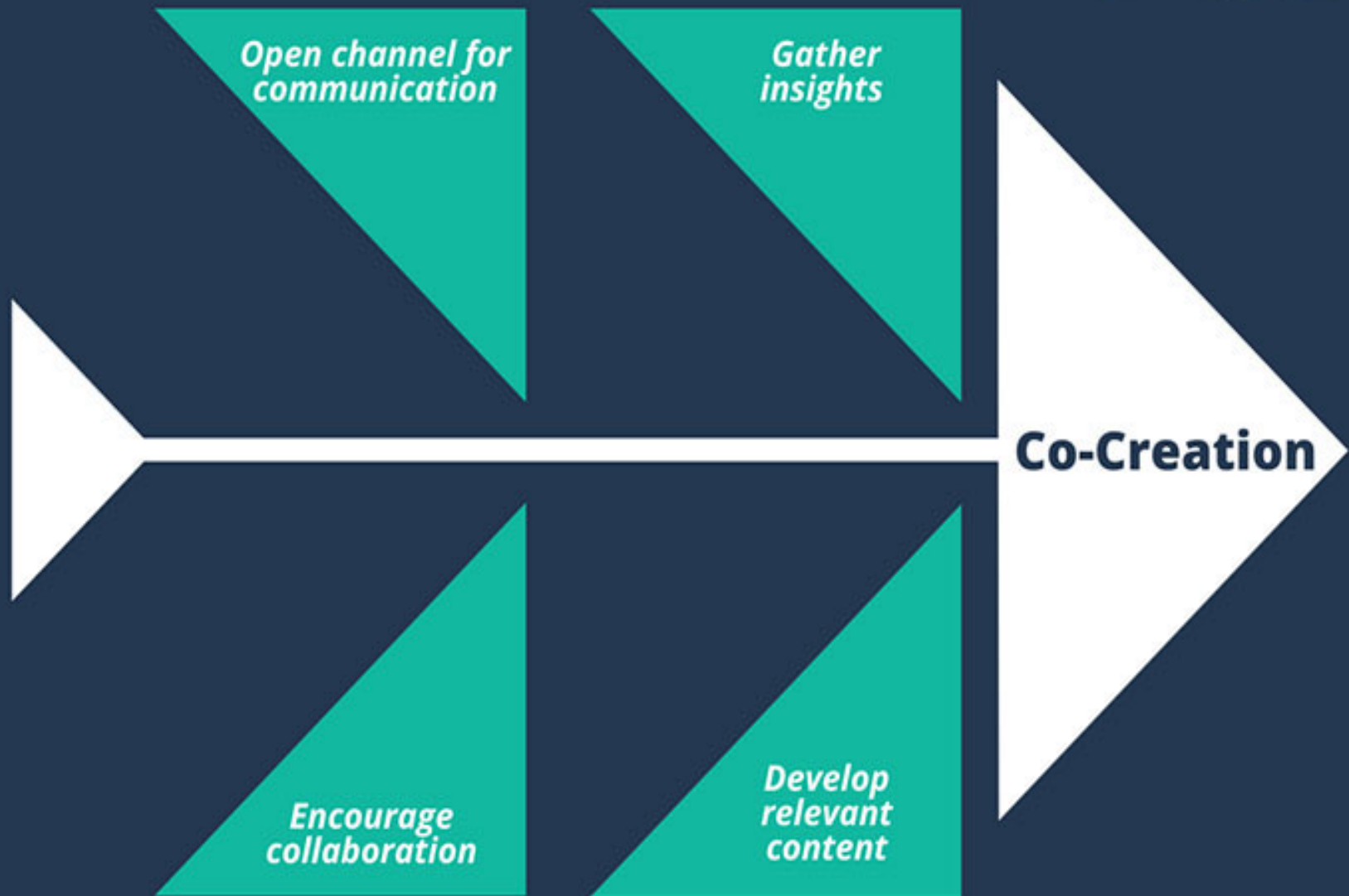
Consultation is not a one-time event

- Desk research – government self-assessment, reports of implementing agencies, CSO reports
- Interviews with civil servants, CSOs, experts, beneficiaries
- Stakeholder focus group
- Surveys
- Field test (user-perspective check)

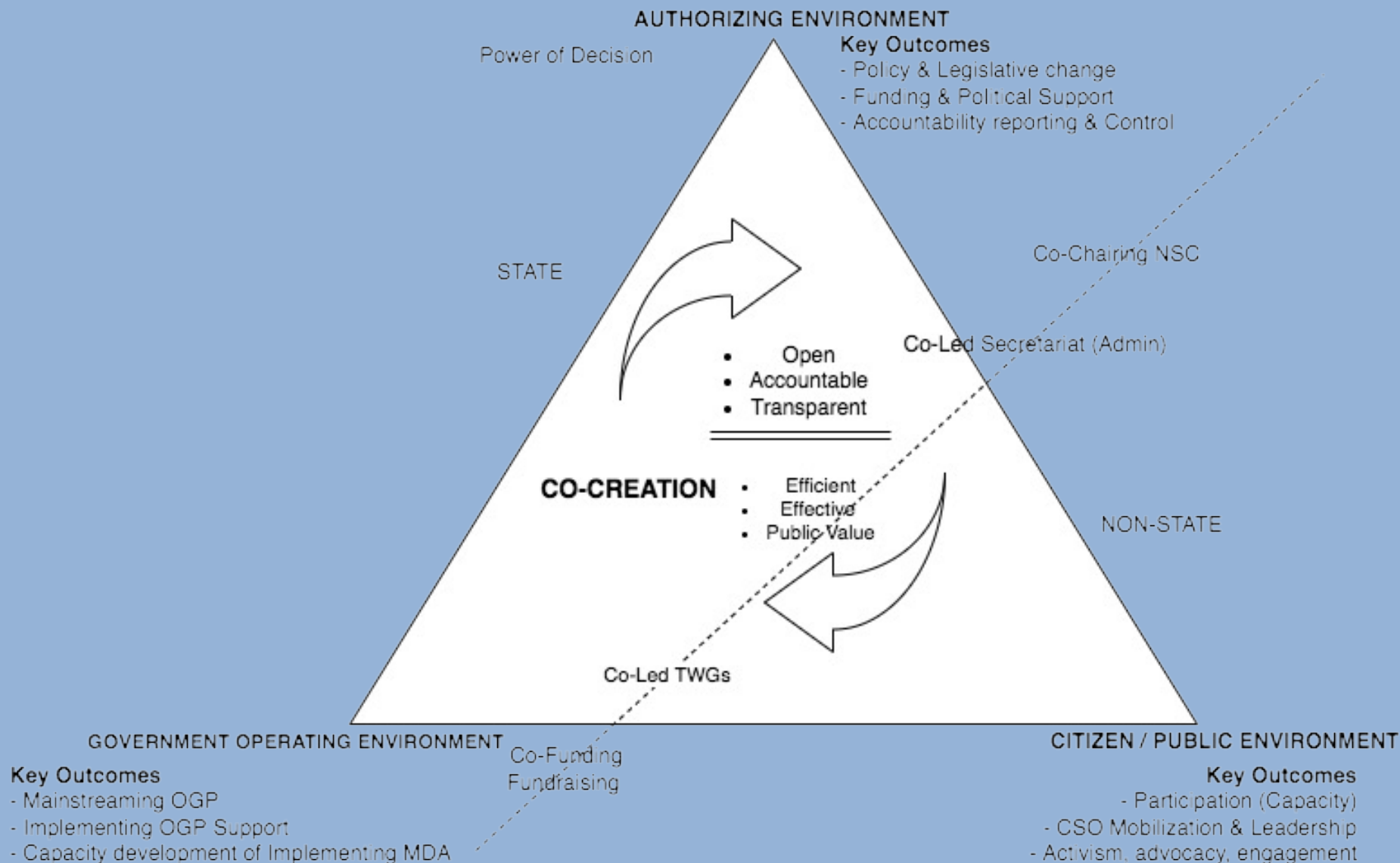


Status of Subnational OGP Implementation
